- Individual artists, collectives, or collaborative groups

We especially encourage applications from those who face multiple barriers to participation, including artists from racialised communities, LGBTQIA+ artists, and those with intersecting identities.

To apply, you must be a member of Disability Arts Cymru.

Membership is **free** to all self-identifying disabled, d/Deaf or neurodivergent people based in Wales.
