The partaking galleries are listed by region in the following order:



Grizedale Arts, Cumbria

Over the last two decades Grizedale Arts has become an acclaimed and influential model for a new kind of art institution, one that works beyond the established structures of the contemporary art world. Maintaining a light-footed and unbureaucratic approach, it works by invitation from, and in response to, the needs of its local rural community through productive partnerships between the many different local cultures. Central to their ethos is the pursuit of valuable function for art; placing craft skills, collaborative production and the expertise of non-artists at centre stage through commissioning, curating, making and education.

Spaces available for WAIWAV interventions:

We would host the artist project in **The Farmer's Arms**. Grizedale Arts and the local community raised funds to purchase The Farmer's Arms in spring 2021. They are now transforming this muchloved Grade II listed inn into a creative and industrious hub. An inspirational model for the institution of the future, it will be an exemplar in its approach to diversity, equality, access, environmental sustainability, education and employment, giving creativity a function and purpose that benefits all. It will be a place to learn from each other, to develop solutions to shared concerns and to grow and fulfil new ambitions.

Harris Museum and Art Gallery, Preston

The Harris is closing its doors in October 2021 to begin work on a £10million project to restore and reimagine the Harris as a 21st century community, cultural and learning space.

We see this as an opportunity to go beyond the walls of the Harris and to creatively explore the spaces of our beautiful city. We have listed some key spaces of Preston which are open, inspiring and accessible to all.

Spaces available for WAIWAV interventions:



The Flag Market is a stunning open space within the city centre of Preston, crowned by the Victorian Grade 1 listed Harris Museum and Art Gallery. This space is used for key city events and civic celebrations throughout the year and has a high footfall.



Avenham Park

The beautiful Avenham Park, is located in the heart of the city centre. It is a green oasis within the industrial city. The park features a natural amphitheatre ideal for performances and a Japanese Rock Garden created in the 1930s. It also features the very popular Pavilion Café with a riverside view.

The Harris will be operating a small pop up library throughout closure. This may have a small retail space attached to it.

HOME, Manchester

HOME is committed to finding new opportunities for artists to develop and showcase new work. We believe HOME being a partner is a great opportunity for artists (regional and national) to create a bold intervention that that will have impact on a national level. Spaces available for WAIWAV interventions:

1. HOME's Ground floor Foyer (outside the main gallery)

This is the main entrance to the building. This space is positioned next to the box office, shop and gallery. It's important to consider that the box office staff will be taking calls throughout the day so the artist will need to consider volume levels.

2. HOME's Outside Space

This space outside the building is on First Street and has an outdoor seating area which is often busy during the Summer months.

Additional support:

HOME would be delighted to work closely with the artist to support them and develop the idea. If the artist would like to take up this opportunity, sessions will be available with our Talent Development Producers, giving the artist an opportunity to discuss and develop the intervention together.

At Liverpool Biennial, we are committed to improving access to art and culture for disabled people across all aspects of our organisation, including removing barriers for our audiences, staff and artists to create and enjoy world-class art. We acknowledge the disproportionate lack of support and opportunities for disabled people in our sector and through our programming, want to ensure that work by disabled artists is championed, showcased and prioritised across the city and the UK.

Spaces available for WAIWAV interventions:

Liverpool Biennial do not have a permanent venue or space - we work with partners across the city, inviting artists to animate public spaces, disused buildings and arts venues. We'd like to work with our chosen artist to find a space that best suits them and their project - this might be a park or public square in the city centre, or a quieter space such as the Bluecoat Gallery garden or courtyard. It might be a shopping centre, high street or a historic building such as St. Lukes 'Bombed Out Church' or the Anglican Cathedral.

THW cares for Wakefield's art collection, which includes significant works by Hepworth and her contemporaries, displayed alongside a diverse programme of modern and contemporary exhibitions, and supported by public, digital and community events. In 2019 we opened The Hepworth Wakefield Garden designed by internationally acclaimed landscape architect Tom Stuart-Smith. The garden is free for all to enjoy. Local people tell us it provided a space of joy and solace during the pandemic, and as we rebuild our audiences, we want to explore its full potential in supporting their recovery.

Towner Art Gallery, Eastbourne

Collecting and exhibiting contemporary art for almost 100 years, Towner Eastbourne sits where the coast and the South Downs meet. It presents exhibitions of national and international importance for audiences in Eastbourne, the UK and beyond and delivers an inclusive, connected and accessible public programme of live events, film and creative learning. It was awarded Art Fund Museum of the Year 2020 in recognition of its commitment to promoting under-represented artists in its programme and serving the needs of its intergenerational and diverse communities

Towner's Collection is best known for its modern British art, including the largest and most significant body of work by Eric Ravilious and a growing collection of international contemporary art including works by Dineo Seshee Bopape, John Akomfrah, Lawrence Abu Hamdan, Becky Beasley, Tacita Dean, Grayson Perry, Wolfgang Tillmans and most recently Rachel Jones. The gallery is a free and welcoming community space providing places for study and relaxation including its Collection Library and a cinema screening a regular programme of films.

Towner has a long-standing and successful gallery-based engagement programme. Our ambitious new engagement strategy Making Together aims to support a new, sustainable climate of creativity, with artists and communities working collaboratively

to create new work both in and outside the gallery over the next 5 years.

Its expanding professional development programme for artists offers opportunities for residencies, mentoring, collaboration and showcasing.

Spaces available for WAIWAV interventions:

Interventions at Towner could take place in numerous locations and we are open to exploring all options with the selected artist. Possible spaces include our foyer areas and stairwells, our large lift, the glazed window at the front of the building, the plaza area outside Towner (permissions would need to be obtained) and our café and café balcony area. Each of these spaces would be populated by public throughout the day and would allow for an element of surprise, rather than a formal setting.

The Gallery's Reception/shop area and outside terrace will be available. (The Gallery will be in change over at the time of the event so unfortunately the upstairs galleries will be out of action). The weather should be favourable at that time of year and the terrace that wraps around the gallery could be a good space as well as the Gallery's large downstairs area. There will be an exhibition with sculpture in the downstairs Sunley Gallery which joins on to the reception, so any activity in the Sunley Gallery we would need to be pre-approved to avoid risk to the artwork.
